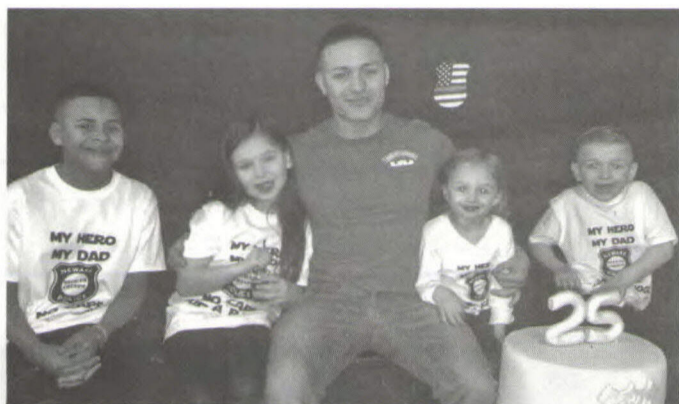

Dear Fellow Patriot,

Should a cop go to jail just for doing his job protecting us?

I say, "**HECK NO!**" -- and I hope you do too.

Because my name is Joe Arpaio. You may know me as "America's Toughest Sheriff."

And I want to share with you the plight of Jovanny Crespo -- an excellent officer who is facing **LIFE IN PRISON.**

What did Jovanny do to "merit" such an extreme punishment?

Jovanny risked his life in a high-speed pursuit to stop two drug-dealing thugs with long criminal rap sheets, one of whom had recently beaten his girlfriend, stole her car, and was driving so recklessly that someone was going to get killed.

In my fifty-five years of law enforcement experience, I've rarely seen such a flagrant abuse of prosecutorial power.

Yet, sadly, beating up on the police is becoming something of a sport for many inner-city prosecutors trying to make a name for themselves.

Such anti-cop District Attorneys think that they can advance their political careers by going after innocent police officers and throwing them to the wolves.

It's a disgusting mob mentality.

Now Jovanny Crespo is squarely in the crosshairs of the "War on Cops" and he needs our immediate help.

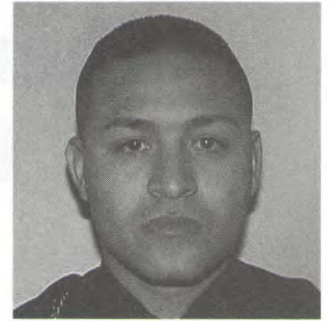
Jovanny is a married father of four children -- and he's facing manslaughter charges that could break his family apart forever.

I think once you hear what really happened, you'll be hopping mad at the politicized prosecutor who is going after Jovanny.

It all started on the night of January 28, 2019, in Newark, New Jersey, when one of Jovanny's fellow officers, Valerie Sanchez, pulled over a car for speeding.

As she approached the car, Sanchez told the two men in it to put their hands where she could see them. She told them to do this nine times -- and they refused nine times!

Looking in the car, **Sanchez saw a gun** on the driver's seat in plain view. She immediately backed away from the car and called for backup.

No sooner had she done that than the car sped off and began recklessly careening through the streets of Newark.

It was instantly clear that the two men in the car were armed, up to no good, and likely to hurt or kill someone if they weren't stopped.

In fact, and the police didn't know it then, but the driver had stolen his girlfriend's car after recently beating her up!

Jovanny and his partner responded to Sanchez's call for help and joined in on the pursuit.

It's amazing that no innocent people were hurt by the chaotic car chase that followed...

...because the two suspects ran red lights, hit speeds of up to 70 mph on city streets, drove on sidewalks, swerved into opposing traffic lanes, ricocheted off parked cars, and generally turned their car into a deadly unguided missile.

Not only that, but when Jovanny got out of his car the first time to stop the suspects, the passenger pointed his gun directly at Jovanny.

It's a miracle that he didn't pull the trigger or else I might be writing you asking support for a memorial fund to take care of Jovanny's four children and his wife.

But pointing a gun at a police officer means two things...

...these two men were **of a mind to kill cops** that night and they **had to be stopped**.

After four hair-raising minutes of the pursuit, the suspects' vehicle finally came to a stop. Jovanny jumped out of his patrol car, approached the vehicle, and shouted for them to surrender.

But they decided not to surrender peacefully.

Instead, the passenger pointed his gun at Jovanny for the **SECOND TIME** and this time Jovanny couldn't count on another miracle to protect him.

Jovanny did what he was trained to do and discharged his weapon. Unfortunately, the driver died, but the passenger lived.

Other officers quickly surrounded the car and found the loaded gun, as well as drugs.

The truth is that Jovanny is a good cop who looked danger directly in the eye that night -- and refused to back down.

But that's not how things work in the twisted, upside-down world of inner-city politics.

You see, an anti-cop prosecutor decided to charge Jovanny Crespo with manslaughter -- even though he was trying to stop the mayhem these two lunatic suspects were causing!

A manslaughter conviction would mean life in prison for Jovanny -- or worse. Because every felon behind bars would love nothing more than to "take out" Jovanny to earn some prison street cred. So Jovanny's life is in serious danger!

Jovanny needs to be at home with his wife and four children, not rotting in a prison cell surrounded by felons who want to off him!


Jovanny's trial will begin shortly. There's no time to spare.

Help me save Jovanny and reunite him with his children. He shouldn't be in jail for just doing his job as a cop.

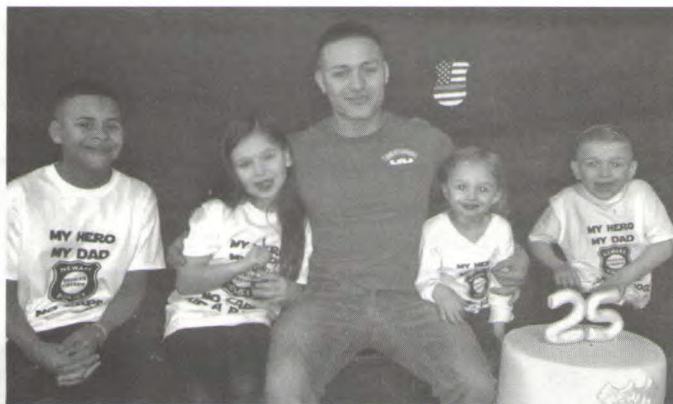
